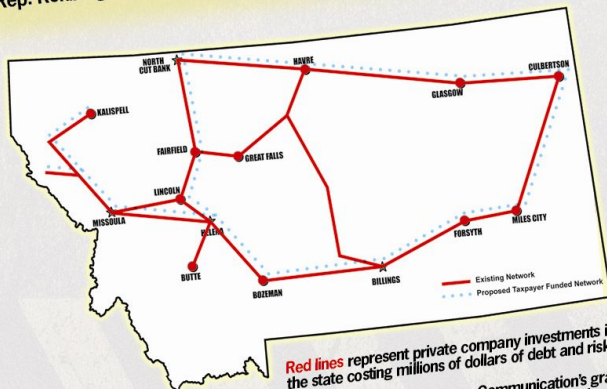
Bresnan Communications wants to waste your tax dollars to build a broadband network in Montana. **Problem? It already exists.**
