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**Charter Communications, Inc.
Network Expansion Plan Update**

Charter Communications, Inc. (“Charter” or the “Company”) respectfully submits this Network Expansion Plan Update (“Update”) to provide the Commission with revised information regarding its Network Expansion Implementation Plan.¹ A summary of completed work is also included for the Commission’s information.²

BACKGROUND

On July 5, 2016, Charter submitted its Network Expansion Implementation Plan³ regarding its plans to implement Ordering Clause B.1.⁴ On July 26, 2016, Charter filed a Revised

Network Implementation Plan to present additional locational information regarding the network expansion plan (collectively, the “Network Expansion Plan” or “Plan”).⁵ In accordance with the opportunity to file quarterly updates to the Plan “as necessary,”⁶ on November 18, 2016, an additional Update to the Plan was submitted and this further Update is being filed to explain additional changes to the Plan.⁷

SUMMARY OF UPDATES TO THE NETWORK EXPANSION PLAN

Additional details regarding where adjustments were made to the Plan are included as Confidential Exhibit A. Revised spreadsheets detailing the location and geospatial information of each passing are included as Confidential Exhibits B-1 through B-4.

COMPLETED WORK

Since the last update, Charter has completed build-out to an additional 2,860 passings across 49 counties and approximately 250 municipalities. Major areas of completed passings include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Albany County for approximately 281 passings, including the Village of Menands, Towns of Colonie, Bethlehem, and New Scotland, and the City of Albany.
- Erie County for approximately 336 passings, including areas such as the Towns of Amherst, Boston, Orchard Park, Derby, and the City of Buffalo.

- Kings County for approximately 285 passings in Brooklyn.
- New York County for approximately 553 passings in the City of New York.
- Saratoga County for approximately 373 passings, including the Towns of Milton, Northumberland, Stillwater, Clifton Park, Ballston Lake, Halfmoon, and Wilton, and the City of Saratoga Springs.
- Sullivan County for approximately 84 passings, including the Towns of Fallsburg, Liberty, Victor, Thompson, and the Village of Woodridge.
- Ulster County for approximately 143 passings, including the Towns of Rochester, Ulster, and Saugerties, and the City of Kingston.
- Wayne County for approximately 78 passings, including the Towns of Macedon, Walworth, Newark, and Williamson.

CONCLUSION

Charter remains committed to the significant task of bringing broadband to 145,000 unserved or underserved homes and businesses in New York, as well as to compliance with the Conditions of the Merger Order. Charter will continue to work closely with the Commission to successfully implement the Network Expansion Plan as well as with the BPO to assist the State in support of the NY Broadband program.
