Re: Case 15-M-0388 - Joint Petition of Charter Communications and Time Warner Cable for Approval of a Transfer of Control of Subsidiaries and Franchises, Pro Forma Reorganization, and Certain Financing Arrangements.

Dear Ms. Helmer and Mr. Falk:

We have received the petition of Time Warner Cable Inc. and Charter Communications, Inc. dated July 2, 2015 seeking authority, pursuant to Public Service Law Sections 100, 101, and 222, to transfer a controlling interest in certain Time Warner Cable telephone systems, cable systems, franchises and assets to Charter and to issue debt. On July 10, 2015, a Supplement was received seeking further approval under PSL § 99(2) for a transfer of Time Warner Cable's telephone franchises.

According to Sections 99 and 100 of the Public Service Law, such an application is deemed approved after ninety (90) days of filing unless the Commission or its designee notifies the petitioner in writing, within the time period, that the public interest requires the Commission's review and its written order. The Director of the Office of Telecommunications has been designated by the Commission to review such petitions under Sections 99 and 100.

According to Section 101 of the Public Service Law, such an application is deemed approved after forty-five (45) days of filing unless the Commission or its designee notifies the petitioner in writing, within the time period, that the public interest requires the Commission's review and its written order. The Director of the Office of Accounting, Audits and Finance has been designated by the Commission to review such petitions under Section 101.


